

We're honored to have you on this journey with us, as we champion community, connection and empathy through the arts.





INDIVIDUALS SERVED IN FISCAL YEAR 2022 = 8,336

7,566 Adults, including Artists, Veterans, and the Public

770 Youth, under the age of 18, plus an additional **90,544 virtual impressions**. We served **167** people through paid services and programming, and we served **7,162** people through free participation in our Veterans' Papermaking Program--Frontline Paper--and through exhibitions and community events. Even more were served by online video tutorials and livestreams.

Frontline Arts held our first in-person annual benefit since 2019 at Neshanic Valley on April 30th, 2022, honoring our longstanding history with the Somerset County Park Commission and with our first inperson Land Acknowledgement by Nanticoke Indian tribal member Karelle Hall. We also had our very first Veteran artist-in residence Mark Oldland, supported by the 52 Reasons to Love a Vet Fund.

We successfully obtained additional Emergency Funding via NJSCA, and 2 grants for ADA improvements: the Capital Arts grant for a 2story platform lift and a Grassmann Trust grant to update the restroom. We were also notified of our very first Creative Forces grant through the NEA-MAAA for the Frontline Paper veteran program. Plus, we celebrated the 10-year anniversary of Frontline Paper with the Power of Collective Exhibition.

It's been a **great year of workshops across all programs** from Frontline Paper, Scrubs, the Migration Project, Youth, Adult Ed and Community events and exhibitions, bringing back many in-person events.
